Autumn Term - Nursery

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

- Select and use activities and resources, with help when needed. This helps them to achieve a goal they have chosen, or one which is suggested to them.
- Develop their sense of responsibility and membership of a community
- Become more outgoing with unfamiliar people in the safe context of their setting Show more confidence in new social situations Talk about their feelings using words like happy, sad, angry or worried.

Communication & Language:

- Pay attention to more than one thing at a time, which can be difficult.
- Enjoy listening to longer stories and can remember much of what happens
- Understand a question or instruction that has two parts.

Literacy:

- Notice some print, such as the first letter of their name. A bus or door number, or a familiar logo.
- Enjoy drawing freely
- Add some marks to their drawings, which they give meaning to for example 'That says Mummy.'
- Make marks on their picture to stand for their name
- Develop play around favourite stories using props.

Expressive Arts & Design:

- Join in with songs and rhymes making some sounds
- Make rhythmical and repetitive sounds
- Explore a range of sound makers and instruments and play them in different ways
- Explore paint, using fingers and other parts of their bodies as well as brushes and other tools

Understanding the World:

- Make connections between the features of their family and other families
- Notice difference between people

Physical Development:

- Continue to develop their movement, balancing, riding and ball skills
- Skip, hop, stand on one leg and hold a pose for a game like musical statues. Start taking part in some group activities which they make up for themselves, or in teams
- Gather the right resources to carry out their own plan e.g choosing a spade

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No Outsiders:

- Key Texts will continue to be used in order to promote positive belonging language, and inclusion within the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- SCARF resources, alongside RSHE Journey in Love texts will be used the develop an age appropriate understanding
